A scratch day for golf as hosts Jay Westman and Dave Duckett lead teams to over \$1,000,000 raised for Rockyview General Hospital!

It was the gentleman's game of the century at the annual Rockyview Invitational Golf Tournament. Hosts, Jay Westman, Chairman & CEO of Jayman Built, and Dave Duckett, President of Plains Midstream Canada were joined by 58 teams, all competing for their industry's right to wear the green jacket. Honor was defended and winners were decided by a single stroke.

Once the clubs were put away, the 2015 Rockyview Invitation Golf Tournament raised a record one million dollars in support of the Genitourinary (GU) Clinic at Rockyview General Hospital.

The day was a friendly competition between Calgary's captain of the Real Estate, Jay Westman, and captain of Energy, Dave Duckett. And, while they were competitive on the greens, the two share a strong belief that health care is central to what makes Alberta a great place to live, work and play.

Golfers teed off representing their respective industries in hopes that their captain would take the coveted tournament green jacket. In the end, it was Real Estate that only just made its way to the Leader Board. After golf, the biggest after-party tent had golfers bidding on some one of a kind auction items while enjoying delectable food and interacting with a mock GU clinic room and video cystoscopy.

The philanthropic spirit displayed at the tournament is the perfect example of what makes Calgary so great, says Jill Olynyk, CEO Calgary Health Trust.

"We are very proud to partner with Jay Westman, Dave Duckett and the teams at Jayman Built and Plains Midstream Canada, whose leadership and commitment to philanthropy within the community is inspirational. For 20 years, Jim Kinnear led the Kinnear Classic to become a tournament was one of the most successful in the city, raising over \$10 million for the Rockyview Hospital," explains Olynyk. "To have Jay and Dave combine forces and pick up the torch, sharing Jim's vision and commitment for a world-class golf tournament, will help to create a new legacy. The unbelievable amount that this tournament has raised will go a long way in supporting world-class care at Rockyview General Hospital."

The money raised by the tournament will support the GU Clinic at Rockyview, which is the central treatment clinic for all patients requiring intervention. The clinic has seen a significant growth in bladder cancer and kidney stones in the last three years making it arguably one of the busiest clinics of its kind in Canada and possibly North America. The team of urologists, anesthetists, nurses, managers, surgical processors and, diagnostic imaging team, help with early detection, prevention and treatments for both men and women. Their services include a number of conditions such as prostate, bladder and kidney cancer; kidney stones, urinary tract problems and male reproductive organs.
